Nothing can come between us and the love of Christ

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that He will not refuse anything He can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us - He rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand He stands and pleads for us.

May they always remember that marriage is a caring and sharing, a giving and forgiving, a loving and being loved, a walking hand in hand and talking heart to heart, always trusting and believing and thanking God for his courage to support them and his love to unite them, now and forever.
